LEARNING CONVERSATIONS

All young people have LEARNING CONVERSATIONS with their teacher. It is based on the pupil completing a google form about learning and teaching. This form is used as a starting point to discuss if the pupil knows what level they are at just now (their working grade) and what their target grade is (their potential if they work hard). Most importantly the conversation is about steps they can take to improve their grades and ask the teacher for any support they feel they need to improve.

The following subjects are awarded as a PASS or NO AWARD

The number 7 means the pupil is ON TRACK TO PASS

A level 5 award is equivalent to a National 5 award
A level 6 award is equivalent to a Higher award
Where the number 45 appears this means the course is a

Target Grade/	Target Grade is the grade that the learner could potentially achieve by the end of the course and should, in most cases, be the aspirational target for learners to achieve by the end of the course. It is based on a careful evaluation of prior attainment, professional judgement of the demands of the current course and detailed discussion with the learner.
Working grade	Working grades record learners' current attainment in a course, with professional judgements based on robust assessments. Working Grades reflect current attainment thereby recognising that aspects of a course may not have been covered by a particular Tracking and Monitoring period
