

Radial Balance

You should already be able to identify **Symmetrical** and **Asymmetrical Balance**. A wee reminder is to the left— Symmetrical on the top, asymmetrical in the middle.

Radial Balance is quite simple—it refers to graphic layouts that are based on a circular design, as shown at the bottom.


